# Information report.

**Information reports** give generalised information about a subject, usually an entire class of thing (such as koalas, countries, celebrations etc).

Information reports consist of a statement to identify the subject of the report and expanded descriptions of various aspects of the topic. These descriptions can be organised under headings.

#### Characteristics of information texts, they:

- are written in mostly objective language.
- are usually written in past tense.
- contain dependent clauses to express important information and detail.
- have topic-specific vocabulary and technical language.

This example of an information text aligns with the Australian Curriculum: English and Science, and the C2C: English Year 2 Unit 5.

It is a useful resource to demonstrate the progression of writing when composing an information report in science.

#### Habitat

Koalas live in eucalyptus forests on the east coast of Australia and spend most of their time in gum trees.

#### Diet

Koalas are herbivores. They only eat eucalyptus leaves but prefer certain types. **Gum leaves do not provide much energy,** so koalas sleep up to 18 hours a day. They are nocturnal, **or mainly active at night.**

Expert writers explain the meaning of technical terms and language to assist readers to make meaning.

Expert writers link information from a range of sources to provide a detailed report on a topic.
